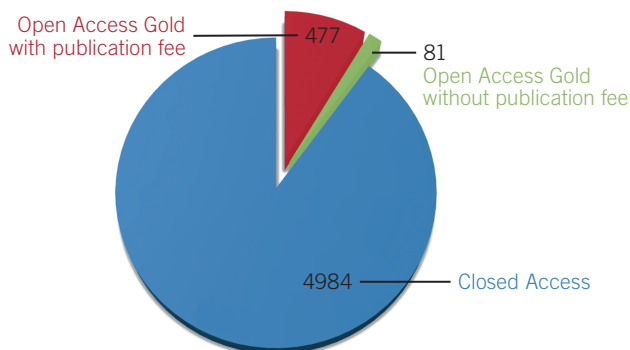
Open Access Initiative

Since the early 2000s, Open Access has established itself as a new publishing model. It refers to the free access to scientific publications on the internet and their unlimited reusability as described in the Berlin Declaration on Open Access to Knowledge in 2003. Open Access is supported by the main funding organizations, including the DFG and the European Commission.

There are two ways of publishing in Open Access: the Golden and the Green Road. The Golden Road means primary publications in Open Access publishing houses, Open Access journals or on publication servers (repositories). The Green Road refers to access to publications which have already been published. The publications, i.e. pre-prints, post-prints or publisher's versions, are uploaded by the authors on institutional and subject repositories (self-archiving).

At Heidelberg University the number of Open Access publications has increased significantly in recent years. Meanwhile, about 10% of all journal publications are published in Open Access Gold Journals. In February 2013, Heidelberg University declared its support for Open Access by passing its own Open Access Policy. The university encourages its members to publish their research results in Open Access and promotes editorships of Open Access journals.
